

# Globalised Africa: Virtual International Interdisciplinary Conference

## **June 11 - 13, 2025**

A frica might be construed as the centre of the world historically. More than other continents, it has been the ground for earliest waves of human evolution, intrusions, conquests, and mixings. Geographically, all the other continents appear to surround it in a manner that affirms its place as a continent of primordial origins. As the most diverse continent on the planet, with an ecosystem, biodiversity, and genetic variability, Africa, in a sense, contains the world within it, and the world around it simultaneously contains it.
